Pause for thought with Rev Lorraine

'Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!' 2 Corinthians 5:17

This September there are many exciting new plans in place to develop and grow our churches as a central hub in the community.

Some of the plans in the pipeline are restarting 'Youthy' and partnering with the YMCA to do so and running up to half term we are also hoping to run a slow cooker course for those on low incomes. We are also hoping to run a course for anyone who has an interest in finding out more about what it means to believe in God or those with questions about God. This course is called START and it is recommended by LYCIG 'Leading your church into growth'. Café church will also be a new feature at St Stephen's Church once a month.

Churches although called to develop and grow are often quite resistant to change. Over the last few months, we've had many biblical readings that have shown us how the early church developed and grew. It also has shown how many of the forebearers of our faith also struggled with Jesus' way of meeting people outside of the synagogue. They even sometimes struggled with Jesus' ways inside the synagogue. For example, on Sunday we heard Jesus again criticize the religious leaders for failing to show compassion to a crippled woman who was suffering because Jesus said they misunderstood the law.

Love in Jesus' eyes meant reaching out to those who were in need whenever and wherever. The faith leaders didn't like anyone doing anything on the holy day. So, seeing Jesus heal someone on the Sabbath was a sin.

Jesus on the other hand saw worship and action going hand in hand.

I wonder sometimes whether we struggle and at some points of our lives focus 100% on loving God with our whole heart or alternatively some other times we concentrate on 100% loving our neighbour. Is it either one or the other and have we got the balance right? Surely both are as important. So although we are getting 'busy' again with activity – let us also remember how we are sustained by God and our relationship with the creator.

I was reflecting on the busyness of life all through the week and how little time we have available to be still and spend time with God. I wonder whether Jesus might feel that we have lost some of that Holiness, that Sabbath time and might challenge us too in where we place our priorities.

Christine Shillaker gave us a challenge when she preached at our weekly midweek eucharist service to remember to PRAISE God. What does this look like for us in our lives together?

the needed repairs and possibly use this opportunity to see if there are any improvements we can make to our environmental impact and aim to become CO2 Neutral.

We are also looking at purchasing an additional television in the worship area.

Our Christian presence is continuing, and the PCC continue to work towards a Silver/Bronze Arocha Eco Award. We Have worked on the back garden and constructed some bug hotels. We have also had a visit from Danielle Carbott of Essex Wildlife Trust and have been given some recommendations from her visit.

We have introduced a digital noticeboard in the foyer and am trialling have paper notices on a Sunday to keep people updated.

We are hoping to find a time to have PCC away time to consider our vision for the next season at St Stephen's.

Ask for ANI Codeword scheme



Ask for ANI (Action Needed Immediately) is a codeword scheme that enables victims of domestic abuse to discreetly ask for immediate help in participating pharmacies.

Although the ANI code word was established to be used in pharmacies and chemists, it was used with us today.

If someone approaches any of our foodbanks, or yourselves personally using this code word we need to be able to help if safe to do so. Protocol would be, if safe to do so for the person using ANI and yourselves, to get them to a safe area out of eyeshot. Ring 999 immediately and report it as a emergency with the code word ANI to Police.

It takes a lot for any person male or female to reach out and ask for help, the lady this morning was in her 60's and very scared. She reached out because she felt "safe" with us to do so. This not only highlights this doesn't just happen to "young people" but also the older generation too, a generation you may not think it could/would happen to, but it also gives credit to all of us at the foodbanks, that we make people feel they can speak with us and safe to do so.

If you have any concerns for anyone you know, anyone that comes into the foodbanks needing help, and they don't feel comfortable with the police being called yet, you can contact these agencies that will come out and speak to them.

Kevin Durrant, Minister of Keynsham Baptist Church near Bristol, began his ministry whilst living here in Colchester. He has long had a special interest in the Creation and in environmental issues. He and his wife Roslyn have attended both the Paris and the Glasgow COPs. Kevin is the author of two books on creation issues.

The Earth will Teach You is a commentary on biblical passages in which wisdom can be discerned in God's creation. In his more recent book, Courting Chaos, Kevin explores the prophetic imagination of Jeremiah applying it to the current climate and biodiversity crisis. Kevin is an engaging and insightful speaker often using images from the arts to illustrate biblical themes. He was the keynote speaker at the 2019 Green Christian conference at Launde Abbey. His written and spoken output appeals to the listener's emotions, imagination and understanding to deepen our love and commitment to God's Creation and our place in it.

FREE Suicide Post & Pre-vention Training

Essex has a significantly worse rate of suicide than the national average. Areas of particular concern include Tendring and Colchester - which have the second and third highest rates respectively overall in the country.



To the outside world they were thoughtful, caring and inspirational. Someone with a loving and supportive family, Secure job and content life. But inside, they were fighting an invisible battle that not even those closest knew about.



This training programme has been devised to support families and individuals affected by suicide, enabling them to deal with the impact of suicide and the subsequent challenges to their own (and family members') mental health, including increased risk of suicide and/or self-harm, and feelings of isolation/loneliness. Plus learn skills to identify warning signs and how to ask others directly if they have thought about death and/or felt suicidal.

This training workshop offers a comfortable and intimate environment where you can speak and share with others who have experienced similar bereavements. Each workshop lasts for 4 hours and will have a maximum of 10 people in attendance.




