Rectors reflection

I love the season of spring. I love the wonderful fresh green colours of the hedgerows and trees blending in with the blossoms of Blackthorn and daffodils. Colchester is to be congratulated for its yearly displays of daffodils along road sides and in parks and the beautiful flower box displays in the city centre.

Also I especially love the spring because this is when my gardens (front and back) are at their best. This year has been especially beautiful because added to my usual daffodils, tulips, hyacinth, euphorbia (spurge) and cherry blossom, my garden has been blessed with masses of pale yellow natural primroses. (I'm praying these primroses are going to keep the weeds down.)

I suspect this is one of the many reasons I love so many of the traditional Easter hymns. So many of them focus on the new life that the world is given through our Lord's glorious Resurrection – often using the metaphor of spring with its new life to assist our worship. And when such imagery is written in words of sheer poetry my spirit soars.

For example 'Tis the spring of souls today;

Christ has burst his prison

And from three days sleep in death

As a sun hath risen.

All the Winter of our sins

Long and dark is flying

From his light, to whom we give

Laud and Praise undying.'

Written by St. John of Damascus c.750 (translated by JM Neale).

Spring and Easter came early this year. It doesn't seem so long ago we were throwing out the Church's Christmas trees and now we will only have a few weeks to go before we will be celebrating Pentecost (19th May) when we will be celebrating Jesus promised gift of his Holy Spirit to enable us to continue his earthly ministry. I think it was probably one of my biggest life-changing moments when I realised we are not just celebrating a one-off historical event but a continual life-changing gift to us all. Our faith is not stuck to a fixed text/a book/ but a living, growing, Spirit-led understanding. And I thank God that the Anglican and Methodist Churches uses its calendar of changing seasons to help us in this growth. I am so glad we will be celebrating this wonderful gift with our friends from Wimpole Road Methodist Church and from St. Margaret's, Berechurch on New Town Recreation Ground. This gives us a wonderful opportunity to publically witness to our faith and to our three church's solidarity. Please try to be there – 19th May – 11 am.

I'd like to end this letter with another Easter song. Note the comparison with the ancient one I quoted from earlier. This one was written mid 20th century by JMC Crum (1872-1958) (and note there's no mention of Easter Bunnies in either – Halleluiah!!).

Now the green blade riseth from the buried grain,

wheat that in dark earth many days has lain;

Love lives again, that with the dead has been:

Love is come again,

like wheat that springth green.

Churchwarden's letter

Dear friends,

Interview for Priest in Charge of St Stephen's and St Margaret's

Following the thoughtful and prayerful process of putting together a shared parish profile, one candidate applied for the post and it was agreed they should be interviewed. The candidate came to St Stephen's on 23 April and met informally with the ministry team and members of both PCCs and preached during a short morning prayer service. They were then interviewed by representatives from both churches, the Area Dean, Archdeacon Ruth and the Deanery Lay Representative. By the time you read this or shortly afterwards we hope to know the outcome of the interview process but no further details are available at the moment. We will share any news as soon as it is available.

Our Annual Parish General Meeting

Spring is here and that means (among other things!) that we are approaching the Annual Parish General Meeting, which is due to take place after the morning service on Sunday 26 May. Holding the meeting is a legal requirement but it is more than that. This is an important milestone because it provides an opportunity to look back at our progress and review all the activity that takes place in our church life and think about the next year. It is your opportunity to see more about the life of the church than you would pick up from attending services or other church groups. This could provide you with a look behind the curtain at, for example, the decisions made by the PCC, the churchwardens and the ministry team; how our finances are going and progress on the building programme: St Stephens Looking to the Future and much more.

You will remember that for most of the last year we have been in "vacancy" (i.e. without a priest in charge) since the departure of Rev Lorraine in July 2023. It was also a year in which we and other churches were continuing to find our way back to full operation after the pandemic. You will see from the annual report which is nearly ready to be shared that, in spite of the vacancy a lot of change and development has taken place and there is a lot of activity and Mission to review. Those that attend the meeting will have a chance to ask questions and make comments. If you are on the electoral roll you will be asked to vote on certain issues. But even if you are an attender but not yet on the electoral roll, you can take part in everything short of being appointed to the PCC or voting.

Do you want to be more involved?

We hope you feel at home at St Stephen's. Maybe you have reached a point you might consider whether God is calling you to join our team of volunteers who make things happen here week on week. For example, could you be called to be a welcome people to worship? Are you good with laptops or sound desks (if not, would you like to learn)? Are you a singer or musician? Would you make refreshments, lead intercessions, do

gardening? Do you have a heart for God's creation to help us work towards Gold Eco-Church? Would you like to learn how to be a sacristan: i.e., to help the priests prepare for Holy Communion? Could you be a fundraiser or grant getter for the building project? Talk to one of us, PCC member or member of the ministry team if any of these things (or something else) might correspond to gifts you have been given to share with others.

Moving on...

I (John Clifton speaking here!) am standing down as churchwarden at the annual meeting. It has been a huge honour to do this job for the last four and a bit years. I do feel though that it is time for me to move on and time for someone else to bring their gifts to bear on the job. When I took this diverse role, there was not very much preparation or information available about what was entailed. I am pleased to say that now the situation has improved. One thing that I have also discovered is that although there is a core of responsibilities attached to the job, people with very different gifts and approaches can bring their own style to it. At St Stephen's there is lots going on. You need to enjoy variety, learning new stuff and being quick on your feet (so to speak). What is most important is to love people and be committed to working as a team to help God's people to be Church in the fullest sense. And you have to keep turning up! But I am not planning to go away. I will carry on with day-to-day project managing St Stephens Looking to the Future reporting back to the PCC and with the other things I do. Anyway, thanks to all of you for your help and support! Please continue to pray for Martin as he continues in the role and for the right person to be the second churchwarden.

A TALENTED musician who the Gazette tipped as 'one to watch' has beaten more than a thousand acts in a competition to play at a popular music festival this year. Izzy Liddamore, 23, from Colchester, has been picked out of more than 1,500 bands to perform at this year's Truck Festival in Oxford.

The solo artist, songwriter, multi-instrumentalist, is based between Colchester and Cardiff, and makes music under the name of Generation Feral.

Izzy entered the festival's annual Band App competition and was voted through the initial first round by the public.

A panel of music industry tastemakers whittled down the entries to 28 promising bands and artists that have now joined the line-up.

Izzy is now on the same bill which boasts headliners like Jamie T, Wet Leg, The Streets, and more, when the festival takes place July 26 to 28.

The news has not sunk in for Izzy yet. She said: "To be honest, it's absolutely mental and still hasn't hit me yet."

"It's impossible to comprehend actually playing a national festival like Truck when I feel like I've spent the last three years dreaming and praying to the festival gods to get an opportunity like this.

"When I got the email, I fully went into shock, it was like the last three years of emails and midnight national express coaches back from gigs all flashed before my eyes."

Izzy makes avant garde music as Generation Feral, and boasts incredible vocals, powerful piano playing, and slick ukulele skills.

Izzy is thankful for the opportunity to play at Truck Festival, which attracts thousands of attendees every year.




