Clergy Reflection

"Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Matthew 28:20

I apologise in advance for this reflection. I know I have jumped the start line with this, but I couldn't help myself in writing a sharing my recent reflection with you. Besides I won't get another opportunity to write this before Advent and Christmas.

Recently, I have been rewatching the Lord of the Rings movies. They are a rich source of J.R. Tolkien's Christian wisdom. The time spent watching these movies has become somewhat of a pilgrimage, a time of reflection and prayer after every period of watching. This week as I reflected, it struck me that for many we have now entered the planning period for Christmas! As the shelves in the shops fill with freaky merchandise for Halloween, fireworks for Guy Fawkes Night and everything sparkly for Christmas the countdown to Christmas begins. My reflection, rather than planning, turned to the discipleship of an unlikely bunch of lads. I began to think about embracing discipleship in a modern Middle-Earth.

As Christians or those questioning, we are all fellow travellers on this earthly pilgrimage from birth to death! As the gentle chill of autumn whispers the pending arrival of winter and Christmas in 60 days at the time of writing, we find ourselves with the perfect opportunity to reflect upon our journey as disciples of the greatest story ever told—the Gospel. Much like Frodo and Sam embarking on their epic quest in J.R. Tolkien's "Lord of the Rings," we, too, find parallel inspiration in the path of discipleship.

The Fellowship of Believers

In our lives, much like in Middle-earth, the journey of faith is best undertaken in the company of others. Christianity teaches us that discipleship is not a solitary path. Hebrews 10:24-25 encourages us to *"consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together."* Just as the Fellowship set out to destroy the One Ring, rallying support and friendship, we too must rely on our community—the Fellowship of Believers—to strengthen our path toward spiritual growth.

Humour, as Tolkien so deftly demonstrates through characters like Merry and Pippin, plays an essential role in our journey. Their light-heartedness amidst daunting challenges reminds us of Proverbs 17:22: *"A cheerful heart is good medicine."* As you prepare for the hustle and bustle of the Christmas season, remember to introduce moments of laughter into your day. Tell a silly joke at the dinner table, share a funny story with a friend, and let joy infuse your countdown to Christmas.

The Call to Discipleship

The journey of discipleship is akin to the quest to Mount Doom—both daunting and transformative. Jesus's call to His first disciples in Matthew 4:19, "*Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men,*" invites us to a life of purpose and service. Frodo didn't choose the task of ring-bearer lightly, nor should we take our call to discipleship casually. It's a daunting task yet filled with opportunities for growth and fulfilment.

Countdown to Christmas: Preparation and Anticipation

Advent is that magical time when anticipation builds, much like our excitement as we turn the pages of a thrilling tale. As we look forward to unlocking each day on our advent calendars, (Don't forget you buy yourself an advent calendar) let's fill our hearts with expectation—not just for holiday gifts and gatherings, but for deepening our relationship with God and understanding His purpose for us.

Just as Tolkien filled his writings with rich history and intricate details, the Bible is packed with stories that shape our faith. Take this time to delve deeper into Scripture. You might consider a daily devotional or a Bible study group to enhance your understanding. Perhaps embark on a spiritual quest of your own, seeking answers to the questions the Christmas story stirs within you.

Encouragement Along the Way

Be encouraged, dear friends, that no journey is devoid of challenges. Frodo faced many obstacles and temptations, yet he had Sam by his side—a steadfast companion who never gave up hope. In the same vein, Jesus assures us of His unending companionship in Matthew 28:20, saying, "*Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.*"

Unexpected trials may arise as we approach Christmas, but they are an opportunity to grow stronger in faith. Channel your inner Samwise Gamgee, offering support and encouragement not only to yourself but to those around you. As you interact with family, friends, or even strangers, be the beacon of hope and love that the Christmas season embodies.

A Challenge to Undertake

Here's a small challenge for you as we prepare to enter this year's Christmas season: undertake one act of unexpected kindness each day, mirroring the acts of service our faith calls us to. Whether it's a note of thanks, a call to someone long unheard, or helping a neighbour, let these acts reflect the spirit of Sam's loyalty and love.

By taking on this challenge, we emulate the discipleship pathway, serving as ambassadors of Christ's love in our world. Remember how every small gesture contributes to a greater good, much as each character in "Lord of the Rings" played a crucial role in the grand narrative.

Make this this pending Christmas season different, as we journey towards Bethlehem in our hearts, we are all given the choice to embrace discipleship with open arms. Let the courage of Tolkien's characters and the wisdom of the Scriptures, emerge each as we journey together in Christmas preparation and celebration transforming and inspiring.

Let us be both humorous and heartfelt, adventurous and anchored in faith, as we walk together on this illuminated path toward Christmas. Merry journeying, and may you find your soul enriched and ready to celebrate the greatest gift of all—Christ in our midst.

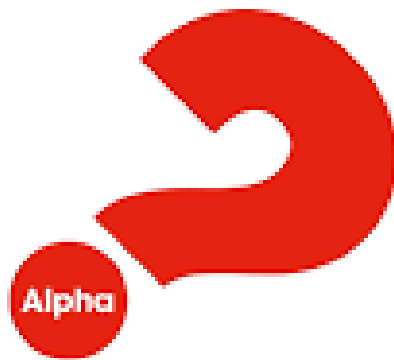
commit your life to following Jesus Christ. At a confirmation service, you make these promises for yourself.

Who is Jesus?

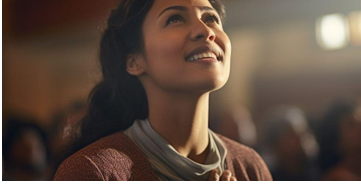
Why did Jesus die?

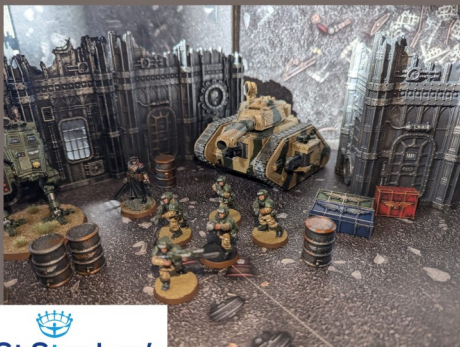
