Clergy Reflection

I love this time in the church calendar. It is a time of remembrance. A time to look back at the Saints that have gone before us who fought for our spiritual freedom, and a time to reflect on the selfless acts of our soldiers who fought for our physical freedom.

I love the bible verse from John 15:13, where it says, 'Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.'

When we look at this period in the church calendar, we had All Saints Day the week before last and Remembrance Day this week just gone, both enable us to see this bible verse typified.

In messy church at the beginning of the month, we looked at the men and women who had given their lives to Jesus and had often died or been tortured for the spreading of the gospel (Jesus' call to us all). Men and women that lived out their saintly lives on earth, regardless of the consequences, so that we might get to hear that Jesus loves us and died for us. Of course, we are just following in His footsteps, because he also laid down His life for His friends (each one of us).

Each Saint that we remember today, was remembered for something slightly different which marked their calling and fame – St. Stephen was stoned for speaking fearlessly about salvation through Jesus, even when he knew that he would be stoned for his words, a true martyr of the faith, and St. Margaret we are told was a figure of profound holiness and strength, known for her charity, and devotion, Margaret's journey to sainthood was shaped by courage, resilience, and unwavering faith. Both of the Saint's that our churches were named after truly laid down their lives for their friend Jesus.

And then this Sunday just gone, we remembered our fallen soldier, men and women who fought for our physical peace and freedom. Who laid down their lives so that you and I can have the liberty that we cherish today. Families left motherless, childless and fatherless for us all. Truly laying down their lives for us for the good of us all.

I took the Remembrance Day service in Little Chesterford again this year. Little Chesterford is a little Village near Saffron Walden. It is where I found over 300 years of my ancestors recently. Ancestors that I did not know I had. 5 siblings of my father's, aunts, uncles and cousins and many more. I found the graves of my ancestors, a bench in the church yard dedicated to them, and Remembrance to one of them on the war memorial of the fallen.

We had no idea until 2 years ago that these family members even existed, it was only after my father passed away, that I began an ancestry search, and many relatives were

found to be born and bred in Little Chesterford.

I love to go there and remember my family; I love to pay my respects to Frank Searle that is on the war memorial. A man that I never knew but one that fought for our freedom. I feel a sense of belonging there as well as pride in those that lived through the war and believed that we all had a right to live peacefully and not be oppressed.

As I reflected on All Saints Day and Remembrance Day, I wondered what I would be remembered for. Knowing that we are all saints through Jesus's death, I pondered – 'was I living as a saint of Jesus? Was I laying down my life for the sake of others to let them know about Spiritual freedom in Jesus?

We did a craft in Messy church where we made bunting and on each flag we had to draw a picture of ourselves and the words underneath saying = 'Saint in The Making!'

I concluded that I still had quite a lot of Saint Making to go, and I'm sure that we all often don't feel like saints, but that is ok, because we are saved by Jesus' sacrifice = made saints by his grace and we all will be continually changed into his likeness. 2 Corinthians 3:18: 'And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being changed into his likeness from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.'

Let us be inspired by our Saints of old and our brave soldiers. They gave up their lives for our freedom.

Let us lay down our lives in the service of Jesus. Let us spread the word that Jesus's love has set us free. How will people know the freedom in the love of God unless we tell them. And let us also take courage from our soldiers and try to make this world a better place by putting others needs before ourselves.

John 15:13, 'Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.'

Church of England and Methodists recommit to working together as Covenant turns 21



Anglicans and Methodists in England have been underlining our commitment to forging closer ties as we mark the 21st anniversary of a historic covenant between our two churches.

The Anglican-Methodist Covenant was signed by leaders of the Church of England and the Methodist Church in Great Britain in front of Queen Elizabeth II on November 1, 2003, with services of celebration at both Methodist Central Hall and its immediate neighbour Westminster Abbey.

The Covenant recognises how much the two churches - which separated in the 1790s, after the death of John Wesley - have in common and commits them to removing further obstacles towards unity.

It has opened the way to new partnerships on the ground between local Church of England and Methodist congregations, ranging from joint worship and sharing church buildings to shared community projects and staff such as youth and family workers.

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York, Justin Welby and Stephen Cottrell, joined the President of the Methodist Conference the Rev Helen Cameron and the Vice-President, Carolyn Godfrey to reaffirm the two churches' commitment to the Covenant at a service of celebration at Methodist Central Hall followed by evensong at Westminster Abbey on 4 November.

Two day tour of the battlefield of Ypres 29 and 30 March 2025

An opportunity for St Margaret's St Stephens and Wimpole Methodist congregation members to join together for a two day trip around the battlefields of Belgium.

The itinerary includes a coach trip down to Dover for a ferry crossing. Arriving mid afternoon we will visit the second largest British military cemetery and have a tour around including individual stories of those buried there. We move onto a Museum involving a number of artefacts and recreated trenches from WW1. There will be an opportunity to visit the Menin Gate- the Memorial to the Missing in the Ypres Salient and be involved in the Menin Gate ceremony at 8pm. A meal at the excellent Captain Cook will follow the ceremony. Our Hotel Regina is in the beautiful Main Square of Ypres.

After breakfast on Day 2 we visit a German cemetery as a comparison to the

numerous British cemeteries in the area. We move on to a preserved battlefield site of Hill 60 scene of major fighting throughout the war including gas and underground warfare. We then have the opportunity to visit Toc H famous as a house behind the lines run by Chaplains to provide rest and recuperation for weary soldiers, It houses an upper room where soldiers took communion and had services there. We plan to have our own service there as part of our tour. There will also be an opportunity after the service to visit the holding cell and firing post for those who were to be shot at dawn. Ironically this was close to Toc H.

We make our return mid afternoon for Calais for an early evening crossing with the intention of arriving back in Colchester at about 9pm on the Sunday evening.

The cost of this trip is as follows:

- o £335.00 per person based on a minimum of 30 full paying passengers in twin rooms.
- o £355.00 per person based on a minimum of 25 full paying passengers in twin rooms.
- o Single room supplement: £40 per person per night, subject to availability.

Items Included

- o Executive Coach.
- o Return Channel crossings.
- o 1 nights' bed and breakfast Hotel accommodation.
- o An evening meal on day 1.
- o Visits and any entrance fees to the sites listed on your attached itinerary.
- o The professional services of 1 Anglia Tours Guide.
- o Insurance specifically designed for groups (see paragraph on insurance).
- o 24 hour emergency response cover whilst on tour.
- o A poppy wreath for the group.

An initial deposit of £70 per paying person to confirm booking.

- o A second deposit of £70 per paying person will be required 8 weeks after booking.
- o Final payment is due 10 weeks before departure, by Friday 17 January, 2025.

Summary of PCC meeting 13.11.24 for distribution to the congregation

At present, money set aside to help pay for repairs of the church has been saved in a restricted fund within the church bank account. However, very soon it will be transferred into a separate Fabric Fund account. That fund now stands at just over £16,000 thanks to several donations.

Charitable Giving. PCC decided to make gifts of £300 each to four local charities - Christian Youth Outreach (CYO); Beacon House; Colchester (Community Money Advice) Debt Centre; Foodbank; and to the international charity, Tearfund.

In addition, a gift of £50 is going to be given to Bridgeway Mission, a Colchester Christian charity working to support immigrants and asylum seekers from Eastern and Middle Eastern Countries.

The Diocesan Advisory Committee and the Architect who carried out the last inspection of the church building are still working behind the scenes. However, there has been a bit of a hold up because there is a problem with finding a copy of the plans which were used when the church was built.

JohnO is continuing to research and experiment with potential solutions to heating the church – more information to follow!

In addition to the hall being offered as a Warm Space for members of the community to access during Foodbank – Fridays 11am until 1pm – a 'Light Lunch' is being offered every other week. Volunteers and donations will be welcome. Please see Judy.

Safeguarding – Kevin's training for the role of Parish Safeguarding officer is now well under way. Kevin and Julie have started offering online Safeguarding Awareness Introduction training sessions to everyone who holds a role within the church. Please speak with Kevin and Julie if you are interested.

Foodbank has used the stage area to store their resources during the warmer weather. Now that we need to move back into the hall for our services and the children will need to meet on the stage, Foodbank storage has been moved into the church entrance.

The Sound Team is planning to upgrade the church internet connection.

The Colne Endeavour Band rehearse in our hall every Friday evening. This year the band will put on a Christmas Concert on Friday 13th December at 8pm, costing £5 per person including refreshments.

The next Messy Church will be on Saturday 7th December from 2.30pm until 4.30pm









Join us for a cuppa and a chat

Reading mentor?

WHY WE NEED YOU

- 1.1 Million children in the UK are growing up with little or no contact with their father (CSJ 2018)
- 2.9 Million children are raised in lone parent families (ONS 2019)
- Boys fall considerably behind girls in reading abilities throughout their school life
- Boys are a 1/3 less likely to go to University than girls
- Boys have been falling behind girls in GCSE's for three decades
- Boys who see their father read for 30 mins a day read more than boys who never see their father read
- Boys from homes where a father is absent are at a greater risk of under achieving in school

"He loves reading, he loves his mentor, he looks forward to their sessions, he appreciates the time he is given by his mentor who volunteers. Thank you for everything - it has been life changing for my son". - Mother.

"Since reading with x weekly, I have noticed the profound impact it has had on his behaviour during sessions, and from the feedback I receive from teachers, x has disclosed his new ability to manage his anger and not react on impulse to situations, x is now able to talk about how he feels to diffuse situations at school and at home.". - Mentor

"Mum talked about the importance of her son having a male role model especially as she mentions that the school has only one male teacher, and she worries that he is in a very female 'world'. Knowing he has engaged well with a male mentor has been a relief for her". - Family Worker.

"The volunteers don't quite realise the impact they are having on these boys. They really have been strong role models. I know it's not just about the reading BUT to have a male read to them shows them that it's not a 'geeky' thing to do. Thank you". - Teacher.
