Clergy Reflection

As the snowdrops break through the cold ground, I'm excited to see signs of Spring emerging as we look forward to the promise of warmer weather. I have now been here for 6 months and am still so enjoying getting to know people in the congregations and parishes. It has been a busy time visiting our local schools, and having the schools visit our churches, getting involved in church building projects, discovering the joys of school governance and charity trustee work, as well as spending my first Christmas here, planning



for Easter, praying with and for our teams, dreaming about what could be, and trying my best to listen to what I am hearing from the church and discern what I feel God is saying.

One of life's biggest challenges is to really believe this one simple truth: God loves you. To know deep in your bones, to understand it and to live in the knowledge of that truth - it sounds as though it should be easy too understand, but God's love and mercy are both very profound. Someone recently gave me a prophetic question for our churches: 'are we living, believing that God loves us?' It is a good question to ask ourselves, as individuals and as a church.

I am delighted to be able to share that we will be hosting a Lent course across both St Stephen's and St Margaret's churches, welcoming both congregations as well as those from Wimpole Road Methodist, and any other people who would like to join. We are able to run this during the day (Wednesdays at St Margaret's) as well as in the evening (Tuesdays at St Stephen's). It is at times like this that we really benefit from our connections; supporting each other and coming together to go deeper in our faith. This year we will be following a course by Steven Croft called 'Exploring God's Mercy'. My hope is that this course takes us deeper on our journey of really understanding God's love for us, and more of what the good news of the gospel means for our lives and our world today. The course consists of 5 sessions, but please do not be put off from attending if you cannot make them all. I am also planning a table specifically for youth at our evening Tuesday sessions, so please do invite and share this with any young people you know who may be interested, especially as I hope to launch a youth home group in the near future. Please see the advert in the newsletter for more information, or contact me directly with any questions or to confirm.

Continuing my theme of wanting to listen, I am arranging a church survey which will be coming out in due course. This will be sent out by email and available to access through our website, there will also be paper options available at St Stephen's and St Margaret's. I really want to encourage everyone to complete this survey, even if you only

answer some of the questions: all honest responses are helpful and everyone is able to remain anonymous if they wish (particularly through the digital version; it is slightly harder to be anonymous if you complete it with your beautiful recognisable handwriting and hand it to me, although not entirely impossible). I look forward to sharing the results at our upcoming APCMs and possibly sharing some plans in response. More details will follow shortly - watch this space!

As we adjust to our new season as churches, facing an ever changing landscape globally, may I also encourage us to continue to pray for our churches, and especially the roles that we all have. As we say farewell to Dan and his family, we pray for them in their new chapter and for us as we settle in to what God as in store for us next. You may notice an advert for a new Church Warden at St Stephen's, as Martin comes to the end of his tenure. We are so thankful for Martin and all that he has given during his time in this role. Please pray for our new warden, that God will stir in their heart that they are called. If you are interested in this role, please do get in touch with me and I can answer any questions.

There are so many important roles in church, many of which are quietly happening all the time that most people may not even realise. I really believe that God calls each of us to a unique role, that we are made with purpose, that we all have a part to play and something to offer - that could be prayer, good listening, pastoral support - it could be practical help with the building, refreshments, cleaning - it could be administration, paperwork, risk assessments - it could be organising people and teams - leading worship - children and youth - outreach - and even preaching! There are so many I haven't listed - but I am certain that each of us has a role, however big or small that be at the moment. Please do consider what God is putting on your heart, and if you wish to discuss any of this with me, I would be delighted to talk it through.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION & ACTION NEEDED PLEASE (St Stephen's Church members & congregation) Full revision of the Electoral Roll prior to the APCM

This year we will be fully revising the Electoral Role. This means that all names will be removed, and anyone wishing to be on the Electoral Role will need to complete a <u>new application form</u>.

Forms to apply to be on the Electoral Roll will be available between Sunday 23rd February and Sunday 9th March at the rear of the worship area or can be downloaded by <u>clicking here</u> or on the link below so that forms are completed and returned by 9 March before the APCM:

Camping at Thorrington

Friday 13thJune to Sunday 15th June 2025

We have booked a return to Thorrington for a camping extravaganza. I think this is our tenth year of going. However, if you



have not been we would love you to join us for all or part of our weekend away.

We have the indoor accommodation which can sleep 14 people (in bunk beds) and then the fallen log campsite which is a lovely big open camp site set in the woods. Thorrington is a lovely campsite on the way to Brightlingsea, it is the Scout campsite, but they allow us to use it as a church group.

The weekend is open to all ages and some people come for two nights,

one night, one day or just the Saturday evening. It is flexible it doesn't matter if you are on our own or in a family. Everyone is welcome.

The rough plan for the weekend is arrive around 4.30pm on the Friday set up camping and then have some fish and chips which we normally order and collect to bring to the site Nearer the time we will place an order.

We then relax around the fire while enjoying a sip of your favourite tipple. If we are lucky some people sing and play any instruments they bring.

The Saturday is relaxed, and we will probably book some of the onsite activities . We also set up some sport activities on our site. Some people sit and read; some people go for a walk. If we are lucky Chris Poole may arrange a nature walk. For tea we arrange a group BBQ and share food which people bring. This is sometimes where people join us for the evening. We sometimes then attend the large campfire for a sing song, run by the site wardens before returning to our site for a more relaxed fire. People can visit all day Saturday if that suits.

On Sunday we may attend the "Scout's Own" 15 minutes outside act of worship before normally breaking camp after lunch. The site is around 20 minute drive from our church.

All the above is very relaxed there is never any pressure to do anything. People dip in and out of whatever they fancy. People bring their own food, and we find this works well. We have a fully working kitchen in the indoor accommodation. There are showers and toilets on site.

We are still finalising the prices per person per night but think this will be £8 per person if you are camping and over 5, under-fives are free. The indoor accommodation is likely to be £15 per person per night. This indoor accommodation has increased quite a lot over the last few years. These prices will hopefully include two activities we will book to do on the Saturday. We really want people to come and have a small fund set aside that people can access if you find the cost is difficult.
